Summary: Provides emergency evaluation and treatment to adults (aged 18 years and older) in San Francisco who are experiencing mental health crises. Serves as an alternative to calling law enforcement for people experiencing homelessness and mental health or substance use challenges that need specialized care and support. Street crisis teams have the unique expertise to respond to people in crisis and de-escalate disruptions in the community. Teams include a community paramedic, a clinician, and a peer specialist.

Fees/Programs: For individuals with Medi-Cal benefits: services are either free or cost a small fee; for others without Medi-Cal: Service fee is based on a sliding scale.

Comprehensive Child Crisis Service (24-hour hotline)......(415) 970-3800

Summary: Provides a 24-hour, multilingual, crisis intervention and short-term stabilization program for families and children who are experiencing emotional distress related to family violence, physical or emotional illness, school truancy, behavioral problems, and other crises. When a troubled family member or concerned observer contacts the program, the family may either arrange to come to the clinic or a crisis team may travel to the home, school, or other San Francisco location to evaluate the problem.

Evaluation includes assessment for inpatient hospitalization. Also offers specialized services for victims of community violence and chronically suicidal youth (age 17 or younger). Please keep in mind that HIPPA privacy laws may prevent the hospital from sharing that information with you. In circumstances when hospitals are able to provide you with information about your loved one, they are able to disclose the patient's name, their location in the facility, their health condition expressed in general terms that does not communicate specific medical information about the individual, and religious affiliation.

Mental Health Conservatorship(415) 551-3657

Summary: In San Francisco, the Probate Court Judge oversees mental health conservatorships and related mental health proceedings. Mental health conservatorships, sometimes called LPS conservatorships because they are governed by the Lanterman-Petris-Short Act, can involve confinement in a locked psychiatric facility, which means the person is deprived of personal liberty. Therefore, there are strict legal procedures and laws that must be followed by doctors and hospitals and which involve review and monitoring by the Probate Court. MAT is not its own patient assistance program, but rather a search engine for many of the patient assistance resources that the biopharmaceutical industry offers.

Fees/Programs: Each assistance program has its own eligibility criteria. Some are specifically for those who are uninsured or underinsured (lacking adequate coverage with the insurance they currently have). Some require commercial insurance coverage. Others exclude those who are eligible for government-sponsored programs or allow them under certain circumstances.
