Crisis Intervention

SOMA Rise (open 24/7)

Summary: SoMa RISE is a low-barrier program for people who are unhoused and have issues with substance use. At SoMa RISE, participants can access clean bathrooms, showers, food, and a place to rest. SoMa RISE acts as a gateway to connect participants to vital services that help them improve their living situation and well-being (including but not limited to medical care, mental health, and substance use, and housing services). We provide transportation to enhance these linkage opportunities with a host of community partners. Individuals must be 18+ and use drugs or be in a drug crisis. Must be ambulatory & must be able to verbally consent to services and respite care.

Summary: Provides immediate crisis intervention and emotional support to everyone who calls. Answered by trained volunteers and supervised by professional staff, all receive ongoing training to best support someone dealing with suicidal thoughts. Individuals calling/texting the line will remain anonymous, regardless if they are adults or youth; the only time confidentiality is lifted are in times of immediate physical danger.

San Francisco Hospitals

People can call to see if their loved one is a patient at a hospital and inquire about their current health condition. Please keep in mind that HIPPA privacy laws may prevent the hospital from sharing that information with you. In circumstances when hospitals are able to provide you with information about your loved one, they are able to disclose the patient's name, their location in the facility, their health condition expressed in general terms that does not communicate specific medical information about the individual, and religious affiliation.

Mental Health Conservatorship

Summary: In San Francisco, the Probate Court Judge oversees mental health conservatorships and related mental health proceedings. Mental health conservatorships, sometimes called LPS conservatorships because they are governed by the Lanterman-Petris-Short Act, can involve confinement in a locked psychiatric facility, which means the person is deprived of personal liberty. Therefore, there are strict legal procedures and laws that must be followed by doctors and hospitals and which involve review and monitoring by the Probate Court.
